SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: This bill revises several current statutes to change current laws applicable to “prosthetics devices and orthotic devices” to “prosthetic devices, custom orthotic devices, wheelchairs, or activity chairs.” The bill would apply to the Coverage would be required when the patient has a documented permanent physical condition that significantly limits the person’s ability to independently and safely ambulate or perform activities of daily living.

By modifying this language in several statutes, the bill would:

- a. Mandate insurance coverage for all such devices when deemed medically necessary to treat someone with documented physical limitations, including limb loss, limb absence, limb difference, or other conditions that limit a person’s ability to ambulate and/or perform activities of daily living. This includes repairing and/or replacing such items when necessary, without limitation by continuous use or lifetime restrictions.
- b. Make it an unfair trade practice on the basis of disability to deny providing any such device when the same would not be denied to a non-disabled person seeking medical or surgical intervention to maintain the ability to perform such activities to safely ambulate and/or perform activities of daily living;
- c. Require all individual health insurance plans, group health insurance plans, to consider such devices habilitative or rehabilitative benefits for purposes of state or federal coverage of essential health benefits.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This bill likely will have implications for health insurers and health insurance plans, and almost definitely will benefit the constituents receiving services from DDC. But there will not be any fiscal impact to DDC from passage of this bill.
