SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: House Bill 49 amends New Mexico’s statutes regarding the unlawful possession, transportation, or receipt of firearms or destructive devices by a convicted felon. The bill replaces current penalties—which vary based on the nature of the prior conviction—with increased first- and second-degree felony classifications.

Specifically, the bill amends Sec. 30-7-16 of the Criminal Code to eliminate the third-degree felony designation. Under the new provisions, a felon in possession of a firearm or destructive device faces a second-degree felony for a first offense and a first-degree felony for any subsequent offenses.

The bill removes the definition of “serious violent offender” and eliminates all references to sections of law relating to earned meritorious deductions for such individuals within correctional facilities. These changes seemingly reflect the elimination of the third-degree felony tier for these crimes.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The amendment is not expected to have a fiscal impact on the Department.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

By increasing the severity of these penalties, the bill aims to deter felons from possessing firearms or destructive devices and reduce the risk of violent crimes. This change is likely to increase actual time served and average length of stay which would allow inmates to engage in meaningful programming. Overall, the amendments reinforce commitment to public safety while holding criminals accountable and increases the safety of law enforcement officers in the community.
