### **BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis: HB 7 enacts the social work licensure interstate compact, which requires the state to license and regulate the practice of social work, sets forth some standards for licensure, require applicants for a multistate license to pass a qualifying national exam, and participate in certain nationwide activities. The bill also sets forth the rules of eligibility for an individual who wishes to have a multistate license, and outlines the requirements of individuals holding a multistate license. If enacted, New Mexico would be part of the social work licensure compact commission, and the bill sets forth the role and operations of that commission. The bill also makes some changes to the definition of social work practice and clinical social work practice
