BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: This bill repeals the delayed repeal provision—Section 6 of Chapter 69 of Laws 2020—of the Spay and Neuter Program Fee established by Section 5 of Chapter 69 of Laws 2020. The delayed repeal is currently effective July 1, 2026.

The Spay and Neuter Program Fee established by Section 5 of Chapter 69 of Laws 2020 funds a spay and neuter assistance program for low-income individuals. It is an annual fee assessed on commercial pet feeds which are registered with the New Mexico Department of Agriculture pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 76-19A-10. Collected Spay and Neuter Program Fees are distributed by the state treasurer, where ninety-six percent of the Fees go to the statewide spay and neuter subaccount of the animal care and facility fund, and four percent of the Fees go towards administering the New Mexico Commercial Feed Act.
