SECTION III: NARRATIVE

This analysis is neither a formal Opinion nor an Advisory Letter issued by the New Mexico Department of Justice. This is a staff analysis in response to a committee or legislator's request. The analysis does not represent any official policy or legal position of the NM Department of Justice.

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: House Bill 67 Section 1 provides for amendments to NMSA 40-13-5 and seeks to require all orders of protection to require the restrained party to relinquish firearms and prevents possession or acquisition of firearms. The timeline for relinquishment is defaulted to immediate relinquishment of the firearms but allows the court to order an alternative time frame if deemed appropriate.

Section 2 provides necessary correlated amendments to NMSA 40-13-13 (the penalties portion of the act) to reflect that criminal liability attaches if the restrained party violates the order's specified timeline for relinquishment of the firearm under the default timeline of immediate relinquishment. Section 2 also provides amendments for general language clarity for other provisions of the act.

Additionally, this legislation would provide specific safeguards to protect the protected parties of domestic violence restraining orders to ensure that upon service of the restraining order, firearms are relinquished in compliance with the amendments to this act. Enacting this bill would help ensure that firearms are relinquished and prevent future acquisition of firearms by those restrained by the domestic violence restraining order, providing assurances for protection of victims of domestic violence.
