BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

HB 91 appears intended to amend NMSA 14-2-1.2 (Law Enforcement Records) to add a new exemption making “visual or audio depiction of the notification to a member of the public of a change in cause of death of a family member” non-disclosable “without permission of the person who receives the notification.”

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Section 14-2-1.1(A) permits, but does not require, the redaction of certain law enforcement records. Requiring permission from members of the public for the proposed exemption when the rest of the language of Section 14-2-1.1(A) is permissive introduces confusion.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

HB 91 would require that the records custodian obtain permission prior to releasing the footage of a change in notification of death. In practice, it is possible custodians may simply decide to withhold those records rather than attempt to seek permission, making that language moot, especially due to the permissive language of Section 14-2-1.2(A), which notes that records *may* be redacted, as opposed to *shall* be redacted.
