BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

House Bill 97 appropriates \$165.0 thousand from the general fund to the Department of Health for FY27 to support statewide prevention of shaken baby syndrome and abusive head trauma. The funding is intended to update training and education materials, fully implement training programs in hospitals and birthing centers statewide, and establish statewide reporting of abusive head trauma incidences. Unexpended funds revert to the general fund at the end of FY27.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

University of New Mexico Hospital currently operates a Shaken Baby Syndrome Prevention and Awareness Program that provides standardized education to parents and guardians of all infants born at UNMH. The program includes caregiver education on coping with infant crying, prevention of abusive head trauma, and the use of multilingual educational materials and clinical protocols. HB 97 would build on this existing institutional effort by supporting statewide implementation across hospitals and birthing centers and by establishing uniform reporting of abusive head trauma incidents.
