BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: HB104 appropriates \$8 million to the Department of Health for FY27 and FY28 to encourage the development of New Mexico’s community-based health planning councils who identify and address local health needs and priorities.

The purpose of the County and Tribal Health Councils Act is to improve the health of New Mexicans by encouraging the development of comprehensive, community-based health planning councils to identify and address local health needs and priorities.

The County and Tribal Councils Act also allows for collaborative partnership between Tribal leadership/governments, County governments, State Governments, and stakeholders to engage in comprehensive, community-based planning and advocacy to strengthen and improve the health, safety and welfare of tribal communities of Nations, Pueblos and Tribes. Tribal health councils engage in various activities, not limited to, tribal assessments, resource developments, strategy-based planning and provides recommendations that support Nations, Pueblos and Tribes councils and leaderships, while rooted in tradition, culture and holistic ideologies.
