BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: The Artificial Intelligence Accountability Act (“the Act”) requires that covered providers include a clear, conspicuous, understandable, and permanent disclosure when content is created by artificial intelligence. The Act requires that covered providers create a free publicly accessible provenance tool that would allow users to read provenance data embedded in the content. The Act further requires that large online platforms provide a user interface to request that deceptive content be removed, with a 72 hour response time. Provisions of the Act will be enforced by the Attorney General.

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

On December 11, 2025, President Trump issued Executive Order 14365, “Ensuring a National Policy Framework for Artificial Intelligence,” (AI EO) which can be found online at: <https://www.whitehouse.gov/presidential-actions/2025/12/eliminating-state-law-obstruction-of-national-artificial-intelligence-policy/>. The AI EO mandates that States receiving discretionary grants from any federal executive agencies may not enforce any identified AI laws during the performance period of the grants.

The AI EO also specifically calls on the Department of Commerce to withhold Broadband Equity

Access and Deployment (BEAD) non-deployment funding from states with onerous AI laws, as determined by the federal government. Out of New Mexico's total BEAD award of \$675 million, the state will have \$293 million allocated for non-deployment projects.
