### **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Repeals Chaptered 5, sections 8 through 13, of Senate Bill 3 of the 2025 1<sup>st</sup> special session, which if enacted, HB 156 will eliminate the future implementation and legal effect of the vaccination-related statutory sections in SB 3 that were scheduled to become operative on July 1, 2026.

By repealing these six sections, House Bill 156 prevents the changes from becoming operative and retains existing statutory law governing immunization regulation, vaccine purchasing, and related insurance coverage requirements.

#### **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

NMPSIA is not expected to have a fiscal impact. HB 156 repeals statutory provisions that have not yet taken effect and maintains current law and practice regarding immunization policy and vaccine program administration.

The plan already relies on established medical authorities and public health experts to guide immunization-related services and coverage. Immunizations remain an important preventive service for members, and the plan will continue to comply with applicable statutory and regulatory requirements regardless of the bill's outcome. Therefore, no additional costs or savings are projected as a result of House Bill 156.
