**BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis: HB 164 introduces a new section to the Lobbyist Regulation Act and amends NMSA 1978 Sec. 2-11-7.

Section 1 includes the following new material:

Subsection A creates a new section of the Lobbyist Regulation Act (Act) requiring a lobbyist or their employer who is required to file an expenditure report or registration statement to also file a lobbying activity report (or reports as needed) with the Secretary of State after commencing lobbying activity detailing: 1) the specific legislation lobbied; 2) the lobbyist's and their employer's position on the legislation and whether it changed; and 3) the name of the lobbyist's employer that lobbied on the legislation (either directly or through the lobbyist).

Subsection B requires a lobbyist or lobbyist's employer to file a lobbying activity report if the lobbyist begins lobbying after the legislative session has ended but prior to the deadline of when the Governor may make a decision on the legislation.

Subsection C only requires a lobbyist or their employer to file one lobbying activity report per piece of legislation but does require a new report if the lobbyist or employer changes position on the legislation.

Subsection D requires that the lobbying activity report be filed within 48 hours of commencing lobbying activity in the format and manner required by rule, which is promulgated by the Secretary of State.

Section One Subsection E requires the lobbying activity report for each piece of legislation to be included or linked to the Legislature's website for that piece of legislation.

Section Two of HB 164 amends NMSA 1978, Section 2-11-7 to add the new lobbying activity reports to this section's requirement that the Secretary of State publish reports filed by lobbyists under the Lobbyist Regulation Act.

Section Three of the Bill sets an effective date of January 1, 2027.
