BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: House Bill 199 amends the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act to comply with the federal Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006.

It revises key definitions, creates tier-based categories of sex offenses, tightens registration and update deadlines from five business days to three, and lengthens time for agency retention of registration information. It also adds specific registration rules for certain juvenile sex offenders and expands public access to some registry information.
