BILL SUMMARY

The bill requests an examination of the current status of sexual assault examination kits (SAEKs) in New Mexico, including the identification of any existing backlog and challenges related to testing, tracking, and processing. The memorial highlights the importance of timely forensic evidence collection and analysis to support survivors of sexual assault, promote public safety, and strengthen the criminal justice response.

The memorial does not mandate new programs or statutory changes but instead calls for a review and assessment to better understand the scope of the issue and inform future policy or funding decisions.
