SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: HM51 would require DWS and the Economic Development Department to study the ways in which jobs related to the civil immigration detention centers might be replaced. It also requires other agencies to look at reuse of those facilities and requires EDD to study ways in which the state might assist communities adversely affected by the closure of existing detention centers through the use of other funds and programs.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

DWS would need to devote some staff time to this project, but the fiscal impact would be de minimis.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The requirement to deliver the results of the studies by October 1, 2026, may be challenging, as it may not be known by that time how the three affected facilities are going to respond to the closures. Some may pursue other federal contracts, others may pursue state or local contracts, and any of these paths would affect the number of layoffs occurring and the time frame for those layoffs. That said, the group could continue to do the work and make additional reports. This bill is not needed for this work to occur.
