BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Senate Bill 41 substitution is the same as below but going into more detail than the original bill as to which crimes there are no statute of limitation. The primary purpose of the bill is to eliminate the statute of limitations for specific sexual crimes and provide conforming amendments to existing state statutes. The following crimes would not have a statute of limitations:

Capital felonies. First degree violent felonies, second degree murder, Criminal sexual penetration (2nd, 3rd, or 4th degree), Criminal sexual contact of a minor (2nd, 3rd, or 4th degree), Attempted, conspired, or solicited sexual penetration or sexual contact of a minor (2nd, 3rd, or 4th degree).
