Senate Bill 101 repeals the sunset of the Health Care Delivery and Access Act (Act) on July 1, 2030, thereby leaving the provisions of the Act in place after that date. The act supports access to care in rural New Mexico by establishing a Medicaid Directed Payment Program; it provides long-term financial stability and access to hospitals statewide. The Act is administered by the Health Care Authority.
