### **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

##### Synopsis:

SB 107 proposes a 20 million dollar recurring appropriation from the state general fund to the Public Education Department to support comprehensive and affordable statewide out-of-school time programming for school-age youth beginning in fiscal year 2027 and in subsequent years. The appropriation will be split annually - \$10 million for school districts, charter schools, the United States Department of the Interior's Bureau of Indian Education Schools and tribally controlled schools, and \$10 million for contracting with local and statewide nonprofit community organizations that provide out-of-school time programming. Any unspent funds would not revert to the state general fund.

#### **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

The bill allocates \$20 million to the Public Education Department (\$10 million for school districts, charter schools, U.S. Department of the Interior's Bureau of Indian Affairs and tribally controlled schools; and \$10 million for contracting with local and statewide nonprofit community organizations). Funding is non-reverting.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

Funding comprehensive and affordable statewide out-of-school time programming for school-age youth is a critical component of a mixed delivery system of child care for families. New Mexico currently operates a mixed delivery system of child care, meaning that out-of-school time care is available to families through a range of options, including school-based, faith-based and community-based providers. This approach promotes parental choice, and flexibility, recognizing that families have diverse needs, schedules, and cultural preferences. It acknowledges that no single model of care can effectively serve all families.
