ENFORCEMENT TRAINING TO SUPPORT THE TURQUOISE, AMBER, BRITTANY  
AND SILVER ALERTS AND FOR A STATEWIDE AWARENESS AND PUBLIC  
SERVICE CAMPAIGN TO BUILD AWARENESS AND UNDERSTANDING, IMPROVE  
RESPONSE EFFICACY AND STRENGTHEN TRUST IN THE TURQUOISE ALERT  
SYSTEM.

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS.--

A. STBTC→~~The following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the department of public safety for expenditure in fiscal year 2027 for the following purposes:~~

~~(1) one~~←STBTC STBTC→One←STBTC million dollars (\$1,000,000) STBTC→is appropriated from the general fund to the department of public safety for expenditure in fiscal year 2027←STBTC to modernize and enhance the statewide operations and systems for turquoise alerts, AMBER alerts, Brittany alerts and silver alerts, as well as endangered persons and missing persons advisories STBTC→; and

~~(2) three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) for two full-time employees, one for the missing persons information clearinghouse to serve as a tribal liaison analyst and point of contact for tribal, state and local law enforcement and the second employee for the information technology division to work as a developer on the development of a dedicated endangered persons and missing persons portal.~~←STBTC STBTC→.←STBTC

B. Two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the Indian affairs department for expenditure in fiscal year 2027 for a statewide outreach and public service campaign to build community awareness and understanding, improve response efficacy and strengthen trust in the turquoise alert system.
