16	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
17	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
18	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
19	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding one hundred fifty
20	thousand dollars (\$150,000) when the state agency on aging
21	certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state
22	board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the
23	bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible
24	upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed
25	sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can

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1 proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to 2 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. 3 The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the 4 5 state agency on aging for the purpose of designing, 6 constructing, equipping or furnishing the Cimarron senior citizen center located in Colfax county. Any unexpended or 7 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 8 9 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. If the state 10 agency on aging has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1998, the authorization 11 12 provided in this section shall be void. 13 Section 2.
