16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
18	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
19	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
20	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding three hundred
21	thousand dollars (\$300,000) when the department of environment
22	certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state
23	board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the
24	bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible
25	upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed

1 sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board 2 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to 3 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The 4 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the 5 6 department of environment for the purpose of extending existing water distribution lines and making other improvements to the 7 Arenas Valley water development association water system located 8 9 in Grant county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance 10 remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the 11 severance tax bonding fund. If the department of environment 12 has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the 13 end of fiscal year 1998, the authorization provided in this 14 section shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
