AN ACT

RELATING TO INDIAN CULTURE; ABOLISHING THE STATE AGENCY STATUS
OF THE INTERTRIBAL INDIAN CEREMONIAL ASSOCIATION; TRANSFERRING
PROPERTY AND PERSONNEL; AMENDING, REPEALING AND ENACTING
SECTIONS OF THE NMSA 1978; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Tourism Department Act is
enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] SECRETARY--ADDITIONAL DUTIES--PROMOTION OF
INDIAN ARTS, CRAFTS AND CULTURE.--In addition to the secretary's
responsibility for the overall supervision of the department,
the secretary shall:

A. encourage the preservation and development of
Indian arts and crafts among the Indian tribes and pueblos of
the state;

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1 B. encourage the preservation of traditional rites
2 and ceremonials of Indian tribes and pueblos to increase
3 knowledge and appreciation of those arts, crafts, rites and
4 ceremonials; and

5 C. promote the intertribal Indian ceremonial
6 association, incorporated, located in Gallup."

7 Section 2. Section 13-1-99 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1984,
8 Chapter 65, Section 72, as amended) is amended to read:

9 "13-1-99. EXCLUDED FROM CENTRAL PURCHASING THROUGH THE
10 STATE PURCHASING AGENT. -- Excluded from the requirement of
11 procurement through the state purchasing agent but not from the
12 requirements of the Procurement Code are the following:

13 A. procurement of professional services;

14 B. small purchases having a value not exceeding two
15 hundred fifty dollars (\$250);

16 C. emergency procurement;

17 D. procurement of highway construction or
18 reconstruction by the state highway and transportation
19 department;

20 E. procurement by the judicial branch of state
21 government;

22 F. procurement by the legislative branch of state
23 government;

24 G. procurement by the boards of regents of state
25 educational institutions named in Article 12, Section 11 of the

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1 constitution of New Mexico;

2 H. procurement of information processing resources
3 procured through the commission on information and communication
4 management;

5 I. procurement by the state fair commission of
6 tangible personal property, services and construction under five
7 thousand dollars (\$5,000);

8 [~~J.~~] procurement by the intertribal Indian ceremonial
9 association;

10 [~~K.~~] J. purchases from the instructional material
11 fund;

12 [~~L.~~] K. procurement by all local public bodies;

13 [~~M.~~] L. procurement by regional education
14 cooperatives; and

15 [~~N.~~] M. procurement by each state health care
16 institution that provides direct patient care and that is, or a
17 part of which is, medicaid certified and participating in the
18 New Mexico medicaid program."

19 Section 3. TEMPORARY PROVISION--TRANSFER OF PERSONNEL,
20 APPROPRIATIONS AND ASSETS.--On the effective date of this act,
21 all personnel, money, appropriations, records, property,
22 equipment and supplies belonging to the intertribal Indian
23 ceremonial association, a state agency, are transferred to the
24 city of Gallup for the exclusive use by the intertribal Indian
25 ceremonial association, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation.

1 Section 4. APPROPRIATION. -- Three hundred forty-five
2 thousand dollars (\$345,000) is appropriated from the general
3 fund to the tourism department for expenditure in fiscal years
4 1997 through 1999 for promoting Indian arts, crafts and culture
5 through the intertribal Indian ceremonial association,
6 incorporated, located in Gallup. Any unexpended or unencumbered
7 balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to
8 the general fund.

9 Section 5. REPEAL. -- Sections 28-12-1 through 28-12-3 NMSA
10 1978 (being Laws 1939, Chapter 42, Section 1 and Laws, 1967,
11 Chapter 299, Sections 1 and 2) are repealed.

12 Section 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the
13 provisions of this act is July 1, 1996.
