### A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE COUNCIL ON TECHNOLOGY IN EDUCATION AND THE LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION STUDY COMMITTEE TO EXAMINE THE EQUITY OF CURRENT FUNDING MECHANISMS FOR EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY.

WHEREAS, according to the general accounting office, New Mexico school districts may have the greatest need for investment in education technology when compared to the rest of the nation; and

WHEREAS, the legislative education study committee conducted a survey of New Mexico school districts in 1995 and found that school districts rely on local property taxes for the majority of revenue for computers and other technology capital outlay purchases; and

WHEREAS, ability to raise revenue for computers and other technology capital outlay purchases varies dramatically by

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24 25 district; and

WHEREAS, access to capital outlay revenue is also limited because thirty-one school districts had reached practical bonding capacity and were in need of financial assistance from the public school capital outlay council in 1995; and

WHEREAS, total state revenue distributed from the educational technology fund and direct legislative appropriations accounted for less than twenty percent of the total revenue raised for education technology; and

WHEREAS, of the amount provided by the state in 1995, approximately three million dollars (\$3,000,000) was distributed on a per-pupil basis to all districts while the remaining one million four hundred thousand dollars (\$1,400,000) was allocated to only eight school districts; and

WHEREAS, the council on technology in education, appointed by the state board of education as required by the Technology for Education Act, has recommended that the legislature refrain from making direct appropriations for education technology to school districts because of concerns over equitable access to technology; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated need for a minimum level of technology equipment and infrastructure in schools in approximately one hundred sixty-eight million dollars (\$168,000,000) after accounting for the annual revenue currently being raised by individual school districts; and

WHEREAS, the estimated need for training, maintenance and telecommunication charges is approximately thirty-three million dollars (\$33,000,000) over the next five years in addition to the one hundred sixty-eight million dollars (\$168,000,000) for capital; and

WHEREAS, the distribution method required by the Technology for Education Act provides funding on a per-pupil basis which does not account for local ability to raise revenue or specific local technology needs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the council on technology in education, with the assistance of the state department of public education and the legislative education study committee, be requested to examine the equity of the current funding mechanisms available to the state and local school districts for funding education technology needs of local school districts; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the council on technology in education study programmatic and funding options for equalizing access to education technology resources in local school districts and make recommendations to the legislative education study committee by November 1, 1996; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the superintendent of public instruction and the director of the legislative education study committee staff for appropriate distribution.
