A JOINT MEMORIAL

WHEREAS, a full, complete and organized study of the advantages, disadvantages and recommendations of the various interests involved in the prospect of statewide mandatory collection of empty beverage containers, including those state

agencies that are anticipated to be involved should such a program be adopted, would best serve the legislature's consideration of this important topic; and

WHEREAS, it would be desirable if all affected and interested parties could forge a consensus on how New Mexico should proceed with a reasonable and effective program for the collection of empty beverage containers; and

WHEREAS, the executive department could effectively organize a study and involve the energy conservation and management division of the energy, minerals and natural resources department, the department of environment and the taxation and revenue department as appropriate agencies projected to be active in any statewide mandatory program for the collection of empty beverage containers; and

WHEREAS, a study would benefit significantly with the full participation by and involvement of those persons and entities, including grocers, bottlers, recyclers and others, interested and involved in this issue;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the executive branch, through the energy conservation and management division of the energy, minerals and natural resources department, the department of environment, the taxation and revenue department and interested persons and entities, including grocers, bottlers, recyclers and any other environmental, retail, wholesale or other relevant

interest, study and make recommendations by November 1, 1996 for the adoption of a statewide mandatory program for the collection of empty beverage containers; and
