A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE FOR PERSONNEL IN COMMUNITY PROGRAMS THAT SERVE YOUNG CHILDREN WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.

WHEREAS, most infants and toddlers with developmental disabilities receive early intervention services in their communities through programs or agencies that are contracted through the department of health; and

WHEREAS, children up to two years of age with developmental disabilities or who are at risk of developmental delay benefit from early intervention services; and

WHEREAS, professional licensure of community program personnel is a significant element in assuring quality early intervention services for children; and

WHEREAS, the current licensing procedures, administered by

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the state department of public education, are not suitable and inhibit the recruitment of qualified early intervention personnel for community programs contracted by the department of heal th:

NOW. THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of health form a task force to study licensing procedures for early intervention personnel; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department of health consider the feasibility of administering early intervention licensure: and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force include representation from the department of health, the state department of public education, the New Mexico family, infant, toddler interagency coordinating council, community early intervention agencies contracted by the department of health and families receiving early intervention services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department of health report its findings to the legislative health and human services committee no later than October 1, 1996; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the department of health, the state department of public education and the governor.
