AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS TO PLAN, DESIGN OR CONSTRUCT A FIRE SUBSTATION AND MULTIPURPOSE CENTER IN ALCALDE IN RIO ARRIBA COUNTY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--PURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED--
APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) when the local government division of the department of finance and administration certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The proceeds from the sale of

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1 the bonds are appropriated to the local government division of the department of finance and
2 administration for the purpose of planning, designing or constructing a fire substation and
3 multipurpose center in Alcalde located in Rio Arriba county. Any unexpended or
4 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax
5 bonding fund. If the local government division of the department of finance and administration
6 has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the
7 authorization provided in this section shall be void.

8 Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that
9 this act take effect immediately.

11 RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF
12 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; REAUTHORIZING UNEXPENDED OR UNENCUMBERED
13 BALANCES; CHANGING AGENCIES AND PURPOSES OF CERTAIN BOND
14 AUTHORIZATIONS AND FUND APPROPRIATIONS; EXTENDING EXPENDITURE
15 PERIODS; AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

18 Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--AUTHORIZATIONS--
19 APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

20 A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in
21 compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the
22 amounts authorized for purposes specified in this act. The state board of finance shall schedule
23 the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible
24 upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the
25 issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board

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1 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal
2 Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated for
3 the purposes specified in this act.

4 B. The agencies named in this act shall certify to the state board of finance
5 when the money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is
6 needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this act.

7 C. If the specified agency has not certified the need for the issuance of the
8 bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.

9 D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any unexpended or unencumbered
10 balance remaining from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to this act at the
11 end of fiscal year 2001 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

12 Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE AGENCY ON AGING--
13 PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state
14 agency on aging that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are
15 appropriated to the state agency on aging for the following purposes:

16 A. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the purpose of planning,
17 designing or constructing a senior citizen center for the community of Truchas located in Rio
18 Arriba county; and

19 B. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to fund phase three of construction of the
20 Santa Clara senior citizen and community center of the pueblo of Santa Clara in Rio Arriba
21 county.

22 Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE ARMORY BOARD--PURPOSES.--
23 Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state armory board
24 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the
25 state armory board for the following purposes:

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1 A. seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) to plan, design and construct an
2 armory near Clayton in Union county; and

3 B. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) to renovate, repair or make
4 improvements to various armories located throughout the state.

5 Section 4. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--OFFICE OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS--

6 PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the office of
7 cultural affairs that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are
8 appropriated to the office of cultural affairs for the following purposes:

9 A. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the purpose of planning, designing or
10 preparing bids for a new museo cultural in the city of Santa Fe located in Santa Fe county;

11 B. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for the purpose of equipping a newly
12 constructed library at the pueblo of Cochiti located in Sandoval county;

13 C. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) for the purpose of re-
14 roofing the Clyde Tombaugh space theater and planetarium at the international space hall of fame
15 in Alamogordo located in Otero county;

16 D. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the purpose of planning or
17 designing an addition to the palace of the governors state history museum located in Santa Fe
18 county;

19 E. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the purpose of installing a heating
20 and ventilation air conditioning control system in the international space hall of fame located in
21 Otero county;

22 F. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the purpose of designing,
23 constructing, furnishing or equipping a new pavilion, greenhouse and science theater at the New
24 Mexico museum of natural history and science in Albuquerque located in Bernalillo county;

25 G. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to renovate, repair or make

1 improvements to state museums and facilities located throughout the state; and

2 H. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to design, develop, construct or equip
3 permanent exhibits at the New Mexico farm and ranch heritage museum in Dona Ana county.

4 Section 5. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--CUMBRES AND TOLTEC SCENIC
5 RAILROAD COMMISSION--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon
6 certification by the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad commission that the need exists for the
7 issuance of the bonds, fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated to the Cumbres and Toltec
8 scenic railroad commission to renovate, in order to comply with the provisions of the federal
9 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the Chama engine house, the Osier facility or the
10 Antonito depot of the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad located in Rio Arriba county.

11 Section 6. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT--
12 -PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state
13 housing authority of the economic development department that the need exists for the issuance of
14 the bonds, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated to the state housing authority
15 of the economic development department to plan, design, construct or equip a child-care training
16 center to be located within a one-hundred-twenty-unit affordable housing project in the city of
17 Santa Fe in Santa Fe county.

18 Section 7. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--ENERGY, MINERALS AND NATURAL
19 RESOURCES DEPARTMENT--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act,
20 upon certification by the energy, minerals and natural resources department that the need exists for
21 the issuance of the bonds, ninety-nine thousand eight hundred dollars (\$99,800) is appropriated to
22 the energy, minerals and natural resources department for the purpose of providing a new forestry
23 headquarters office at the Coronado state monument located in Sandoval county.

24 Section 8. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--OFFICE OF THE STATE ENGINEER--
25 PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the office of

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1 the state engineer that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000)
2 is appropriated to the office of the state engineer for the purpose of designing, constructing,
3 purchasing or installing siphons for acequias near Hernandez located in Rio Arriba county.

4 Section 9. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT--
5 PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the
6 department of environment that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following
7 amounts are appropriated to the department of environment for the following purposes:

8 A. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for improvements to the Lone Mountain and
9 Twin Sisters wellfields in the village of Santa Clara in Grant county;

10 B. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the acquisition or installation of a
11 water tank or the construction or installation of approximately ten thousand linear feet of
12 transmission pipeline to connect to the existing water system in Corona in Lincoln county;

13 C. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the purpose of surveying a well location,
14 drilling or equipping wells, purchasing or replacing storage tanks and valves or for engineering or
15 other studies to improve the Lincoln mutual domestic water and sewage association water system
16 located in Lincoln county;

17 D. seventy-eight thousand dollars (\$78,000) for the purpose of making
18 improvements to the Bibo community water system located in Cibola county;

19 E. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for planning, designing, constructing or
20 equipping a water and wastewater system in the town of Springer in Colfax county;

21 F. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for improvements to the water and
22 wastewater system, including a water filtration system, for the community of Miami in Colfax
23 county;

24 G. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for planning, designing, constructing or
25 equipping improvements to the water and wastewater system in the village of Eagle Nest in Colfax

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1 county;

2 H. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for planning, designing or constructing
3 improvements to the domestic water system in the community of Puerto de Luna in Guadalupe
4 county;

5 I. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for various improvements to the wastewater
6 system in the town of Vaughn in Guadalupe county;

7 J. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for planning, designing, constructing or
8 equipping a new domestic and wastewater system for the unincorporated community of Mora in
9 Mora county;

10 K. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for planning, designing, constructing or
11 equipping improvements to various community domestic water and wastewater systems throughout
12 Mora county;

13 L. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to complete the Clovis drainage
14 project from Seventh street to Ingram lake in Curry county;

15 M. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the westside sewer line in Clovis in Curry
16 county;

17 N. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the purpose of making various
18 improvements to the domestic and wastewater systems in the Gabaldon Hill area of the city of
19 Grants located in Cibola county;

20 O. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the purpose of designing,
21 constructing or equipping improvements to, or purchasing water rights for, the water system of the
22 Ponderosa mutual domestic water consumers association located in Sandoval county;

23 P. thirty-nine thousand dollars (\$39,000) to purchase and install a water storage
24 tank and water lines for the village of Grady in Curry county;

25 Q. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to plan, develop or construct a water system

1 for the Canon mutual domestic water association in Taos county; and

2 R. eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) to extend a water line on Watson lane in
3 Dona Ana county.

4 Section 10. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND
5 ADMINISTRATION--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon
6 certification by the local government division of the department of finance and administration that
7 the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the local
8 government division of the department of finance and administration for the following purposes:

9 A. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the purpose of planning,
10 designing or constructing a fire substation and multipurpose center in Alcalde located in Rio Arriba
11 county;

12 B. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the purpose of equipping or
13 landscaping the new Santa Fe boys and girls club in the city of Santa Fe located in Santa Fe county;

14 C. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for the purpose of making improvements to or
15 expanding the facility of the West Mesa little league park located north of Sequoia road and east of
16 Coors boulevard on the west side of Albuquerque located in Bernalillo county;

17 D. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for the purpose of purchasing or equipping vans
18 for transportation of senior citizens and others to and from the Pat Hurley Park community center
19 on the west side of Albuquerque located in Bernalillo county;

20 E. twenty-one thousand dollars (\$21,000) for the purpose of purchasing or
21 equipping vans for the transportation of senior citizens and others to and from the West Mesa
22 community center in Albuquerque located in Bernalillo county;

23 F. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) for the purpose of
24 planning, designing or making improvements, including interior remodeling, accessibility and
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1 grounds, to the former Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe railroad depot in Las Cruces located in Dona
2 Ana county;

3 G. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) for the purpose of completing phase
4 two of development of the East Side park in Los Lunas in Valencia county;

5 H. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the purpose of renovating or
6 rehabilitating the youth center in the former Court junior high school in Dona Ana county;

7 I. eight thousand seven hundred dollars (\$8,700) to design, construct, purchase
8 and install shelves, ramps, tables, railings, water fountains and restroom facilities that meet the
9 requirements of the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 for the Hatch public library in
10 Dona Ana county;

11 J. fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000) to purchase and install lights and related
12 fixtures for the north Dona Ana county ballpark in Dona Ana county;

13 K. twelve thousand three hundred dollars (\$12,300) to design, construct, purchase
14 and install doorways, doors, ramps, railings, sidewalks, windows, commodes and urinals that meet
15 the requirements of the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 for the concession stand,
16 restrooms and parking lot at the north Dona Ana county ballpark in Dona Ana county;

17 L. one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) to continue construction
18 on a recreational park and educational camp located in Dona Ana county;

19 M. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) to continue development
20 of the Chamita fire department and community center complex located in Rio Arriba county;

21 N. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to design, construct and equip
22 improvements to the El Cerro community center in Valencia county;

23 O. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to design, construct and equip
24 improvements to the Meadow Lake community center in Valencia county;

25 P. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) to renovate the city hall in

1 Eunice in Lea county, contingent upon local matching funds;

2 Q. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to purchase two fire pumper trucks,
3 including one with a telesqurt apparatus, for the city of Rio Rancho located in Sandoval county;

4 R. ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000) to renovate, reestablish utilities for or
5 purchase equipment for the boys and girls club facility in the village of Loving located in Eddy
6 county;

7 S. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to plan, design or construct a
8 retaining wall for Lake Carlsbad in Eddy county;

9 T. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) to plan, design, remodel or
10 construct an addition to the existing public safety building located in the city of Gallup in
11 McKinley county to provide for police administration, municipal court and detention facilities;

12 U. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) to complete construction,
13 including installation of fire protection equipment, of the multipurpose building at the East
14 Mountain little league baseball fields located in Bernalillo county. The multipurpose building will
15 include a concession stand, recreational equipment storage, a meeting room, an observation point
16 for security purposes, handicapped accessible restrooms, mechanical rooms and electrical control
17 rooms;

18 V. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to plan, design or make
19 improvements, including site preparation, installation of water hookups, tree planting and grading,
20 grass turfing, installation of an irrigation system and walkway paving, to Rinconada Point park on
21 the north side of Ouray road on the east side of Unser boulevard in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
22 county;

23 W. twenty-six thousand dollars (\$26,000) to purchase or equip vans for
24 transportation of senior citizens and others to and from the Whittier community center in
25 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

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1 X. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to design or construct improvements
2 to the Lisbon drainage channel in Sandoval county;

3 Y. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the purpose of design, site preparation or
4 construction of phase two of the multipurpose community center in the town of Bernalillo in
5 Sandoval county;

6 DDD. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the purpose of
7 completing the design, construction, furnishing or equipping of phase two of the conversion of the
8 Trumbull community center to a child-care center located in Bernalillo county;

9 EEE. one hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$120,000) for the purpose of
10 completing master plan improvements on the site and interior and furnishing and equipping the
11 Holiday shelter in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

12 FFF. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to initiate crime prevention through
13 environmental design projects, including designing for increased visibility, controlled street access,

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Section 74. ARTESIA HEALTH CLINIC--REAPPROPRIATION OF GENERAL FUND--
LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION--CHANGE IN PURPOSE--EXTENDING EXPENDITURE
PERIOD.--The balance of the general fund appropriation made to the local government division of
the department of finance and administration pursuant to Subsection JJ of Section 6 of Chapter
147 of Laws 1994 for designing, planning, constructing, equipping and furnishing a community
health clinic in the city of Artesia located in Eddy county shall not be expended for its original
purpose but is appropriated to the local government division for designing, planning, constructing,
equipping or furnishing a community health clinic, including the option of upgrading to a modular
building, in the city of Artesia in Eddy county. The period of time in which this appropriation
may be expended shall be extended through fiscal year 1999. Any unexpended or unencumbered
balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 75. RUIDOSO YOUTH CENTER--REAPPROPRIATION OF GENERAL FUND--
LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION--CHANGE IN PURPOSE.--The balance of the general fund
appropriation made to the department of finance and administration pursuant to Subsection LL of
Section 21 of Chapter 4 of Laws 1996 (1st S.S.) for the purpose of planning and designing the
youth center and indoor swimming pool in the village of Ruidoso located in Lincoln county shall
not be expended for its original purpose but is appropriated to the local government division of
the department of finance and administration for designing and constructing the youth center
complex, including fields, restrooms, a recreation center and an aquatic center, in the village of
Ruidoso in Lincoln county.

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Section 76. LOVINGTON MUSEUM--REAPPROPRIATION OF GENERAL FUND--
LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION--CHANGE IN PURPOSE.--The balance of the appropriation
from the general fund to the local government division of the department of finance and
administration pursuant to Subsection CCC of Section 24 of Chapter 222 of Laws 1995 for the
purpose of site preparation or transportation costs to relocate a historical building at the museum
complex in the city of Lovington in Lea county shall not be expended for its original purpose but
is appropriated to the local government division of the department of finance and administration
for the purpose of site preparation, transportation and restoration costs to relocate a historical
building at the museum complex in the city of Lovington in Lea county.

Section 77. UTE DAM--SUBSEQUENT INJURY FUND--OFFICE OF STATE
ENGINEER--EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIOD--APPROPRIATION.--The period of time
for expenditure of an appropriation made pursuant to Laws 1996 (1st S.S.), Chapter 11, Section 3
of four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) from the subsequent injury fund to the office of the
state engineer for the purpose of making repairs to Ute dam shall be extended through fiscal year
1998. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall
revert to the general fund.

Section 78. TORRANCE COUNTY FIRE STATIONS--GENERAL FUND--LOCAL
GOVERNMENT DIVISION--CHANGE IN PURPOSE--APPROPRIATION.--The balance of the
general fund appropriation made pursuant to Subsection MMMM of Section 24 of Chapter 222 of

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Laws 1995 to the local government division of the department of finance and administration to design, build and equip a new volunteer fire department substation at Melody ranch near Indian Hills in Torrance county shall not be expended for its original purpose but is appropriated to the local government division to design, build and equip new volunteer fire department substations within Torrance county.

Section 79. TORRANCE COUNTY SHERIFF--GENERAL FUND--LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION--CHANGE IN PURPOSE--APPROPRIATION.--The balance of the general fund appropriation made to the local government division of the department of finance and administration pursuant to Subsection J of Section 21 of Chapter 4 of Laws 1996 (1st S.S.) for the purpose of acquiring new vehicles for the Torrance county sheriff's department shall not be expended for its original purpose but is appropriated to the local government division for the purpose of acquiring new vehicles and repairing existing vehicles for the Torrance county sheriff's department.

Section 80. CAMP SIERRA BLANCA--SUBSEQUENT INJURY FUND--EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIOD--CHANGE IN PURPOSE--APPROPRIATION.--The balance of the appropriation from the subsequent injury fund to the general services department pursuant to Subsection A of Section 1 of Chapter 11 of Laws 1996 (1st S.S.) to renovate and make improvements to existing facilities at camp Sierra Blanca for use as a work camp for juvenile offenders shall not be expended for its original purpose but is appropriated to the capital program

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fund to repair, renovate and make improvements to buildings at camp Sierra Blanca. The period of time in which this appropriation may be expended shall be extended through fiscal year 2001. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the appropriation at the end of fiscal year 2001 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 81. TURQUOISE LODGE--NEW MEXICO COMMISSION FOR THE BLIND--
GENERAL FUND--CAPITAL PROGRAM FUND--EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIOD--
APPROPRIATION.--

A. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection B of Section 17 of Chapter 14 of Laws 1996, the period of time in which the appropriations from the general fund to the capital program fund made in Laws 1994, Chapter 148, Section 43 may be expended shall be extended through fiscal year 1999:

(1) for the planning, design and engineering of phase one of the renovation of Turquoise lodge pursuant to Subsection D; and

(2) to design, plan, construct, equip and furnish an addition to the Albuquerque office of the New Mexico commission for the blind pursuant to Subsection E.

B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year

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1999 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 82. LAS VEGAS MEDICAL CENTER--GENERAL FUND--GENERAL
SERVICES DEPARTMENT--EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIOD--APPROPRIATION--

Notwithstanding the provisions of Laws 1996, Chapter 14, Section 18, the period of time in which the appropriation from the general fund to the general services department made in Subsection B of Section 52 of Chapter 148 of Laws 1994 to plan, design, construct, furnish or equip a secure forensic treatment facility at the Las Vegas medical center located in San Miguel county may be expended shall be extended through fiscal year 1998. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 83. REHABILITATION CENTER--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--CAPITAL
PROGRAM FUND--EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIOD--CHANGE IN PURPOSE--

REAUTHORIZATION.--Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection A of Section 13 of Chapter 14 of Laws 1996, the balance of the proceeds from the sale of severance tax bonds appropriated to the general services department pursuant to Subsection M of Section 14 of Chapter 369 of Laws 1993 to replace the steam condensation lines in building 300 of the New Mexico rehabilitation center located in Chaves county shall not be expended for its original purpose but is reauthorized and appropriated to the capital program fund to renovate and make improvements to the New Mexico rehabilitation center located in Chaves county in order to comply with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. The period of time in which this appropriation may be

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expended shall be extended through fiscal year 2001. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2001 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund."
