14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:						
15	Section 1. Section 15-8-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994,						
16	Chapter 119, Section 5) is amended to read:						
17	"15-8-5. DIVISIONGENERAL POWERS AND DUTIESThe						
18	division shall:						
19	[A. have control over all state vehicles;						
20	B. regulate the use of the state vehicles;						
21	C. hold the titles of all state vehicles and provide						
22	for the security of the titles;						
23	D. register all state vehicles in the custody of th e						
23 24	division and ensure that state vehicles assigned to other state						
24 25	agencies have current and correct registrations;						
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1	E. control the issuance of state government plates						
2	assigned to a state agency and ensure that government plates are						
3	used only on state vehicles;						
4	F. maintain a complete and accurate inventory of all						
5	state vehicles, including those in the custody of another state						
6	agency, and the location of all state vehicles;						
7	G. establish and enforce maintenance standards for						
8	state vehicles in the custody of other state agencies;						
9	H. require periodic use and maintenance reports from						
10	other state agencies that have custody of state vehicles;						
11	I. purchase, through the state purchasing agent, all						
12	state vehicles and assign their use;						
13	J. perform periodic announced and unannounced						
14	inspections of state vehicles in the custody of other state						
15	agenci es;						
16	K.] <u>A.</u> establish a motor pool and provide an						
17	adequate fleet of state vehicles <u>to be available for use by</u>						
18	state agencies in accordance with procedures established by the						
19	<u>department;</u>						
20	$[\underline{\mathbf{L}}, \underline{\mathbf{B}}]$ provide for the maintenance of state						
21	vehicles in the motor pool; <u>and</u>						
22	[M establish and enforce standards for drivers of						
23	state vehicles, including revoking driver privileges;						
24	N. maintain individual state driver records,						
25	including all tickets received by drivers of state vehicles for						
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violations of the Motor Vehicle Code; 1 0. maintain a record of all accident reports and 2 insurance claims: 3 P. maintain a history of state vehicles, including 4 purchases, maintenance and sales; 5 Q. carry out the provisions of the Alternative Fuel 6 **Conversion Act; and** 7 \mathbf{R} .] <u>C.</u> have the power to sell or otherwise dispose 8 of property pursuant to the provisions of Sections 13-6-1 and 9 13-6-2 NMSA 1978 after approval of the secretary." 10 Section 15-8-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Section 2. 11 Chapter 119, Section 6) is amended to read: 12 "15-8-6. STATE VEHICLES--USE--MARKINGS--STATE GOVERNMENT 13 PLATES. - -14 The division shall adopt regulations governing A. 15 the use of state vehicles <u>controlled by the division</u>, including 16 driver requirements and responsibilities and under what 17 circumstances someone can be assigned a state vehicle on a 18 permanent or semi-permanent basis. [and when custody of a state 19 vehicle can be vested in another state agency pursuant to the 20 provisions of this section. 21 B. The division may determine that it is impractical 22 to retain custody of certain state vehicles, and it may provide 23 that custody reside in another state agency in the following 24 cases: 25

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1	(1) the state vehicle is used for emergency or						
2	law enforcement purposes;						
3	(2) the state vehicle is of a special design or						
4	construction that effectively limits its use to a particular						
5	purpose;						
6	(3) the money used in the acquisition of the						
7	state vehicle is subject to constitutional or trust limitations						
8	that prevent its use as a part of the motor pool;						
9	(4) the state vehicle is not based in Santa Fe;						
10	(5) the state vehicle is a state highway and						
11	transportation department truck or tractor or heavy road						
12	equipment; or						
13	(6) the state agency requires the use of a						
14	vehicle on a regular basis, as defined by regulation of the						
15	di vi si on.]						
16	<u>B. State agencies other than the department may own</u>						
17	and control state vehicles subject to the provisions of the						
18	Transportation Services Act.						
19	C. Except as provided in Subsection E of this						
20	section, all state vehicles shall be marked as state vehicles.						
21	Each side of the <u>state</u> vehicle shall have painted, in letters						
22	not less than two inches in height, the following designation of						
23	ownership: "State of New Mexico,Department" and naming the						
24	department. If the department has more than one <u>state</u> vehicle						
25	assigned for its use, each <u>state</u> vehicle shall be conspicuously						

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numbered in consecutive order. The division shall include the 1 words "State Motor Pool" and consecutive number of the vehicle on the designation for its <u>state</u> vehicles. 3

Except as provided in Subsection E of this D. section, all state vehicles shall have specially designed government registration plates.

Е. Only state vehicles used for legitimate 7 undercover law enforcement purposes are exempt from the 8 requirements of Subsections C and D of this section. All other 9 state vehicles owned or in the custody of state agencies that 10 have law enforcement functions shall be marked and have state 11 government registration plates." 12

Section 15-8-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Section 3. Chapter 119, Section 7) is amended to read:

PURCHASE OF STATE VEHICLES--PROCUREMENT CODE--"15-8-7. EQUIPMENT. -- [A.] All state vehicle purchases shall be pursuant to the provisions of the Procurement Code. All purchases of state vehicles [even those not assigned to the motor pool] shall be approved by the [director] state purchasing agent.

[B. Subject to legislative appropriations and directives and the approval of the secretary, the director shall determine the type and number of state vehicles to be purchased each year and how they shall be equipped.]"

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Section 4. Section 15-8-8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Chapter 119, Section 8) is amended to read:

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"15-8-8. LEASE WITH STATE FUNDS.--No motor vehicle shall be leased with state money unless such lease is first specifically approved by the [division] state purchasing agent."

Section 5. Section 15-8-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Chapter 119, Section 11) is amended to read:

"15-8-11. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. -- [The division] All state agencies holding title to state vehicles shall provide an annual report to the legislature that includes information on the operations of the [division] state vehicles, including reports on Motor Vehicle Code violations, accidents and insurance claims involving state vehicles; major maintenance costs; purchases and sales of [motor] state vehicles; and progress of the [division] state agency in carrying out the provisions of the Alternative Fuel Conversion Act. The report shall be deemed to have been provided to the legislature when filed with the legislative council service and the legislative finance committee. The division] State agencies shall make copies available to individual legislators upon request."

Section 6. A new section of the Transportation Services Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] RETENTION OF TITLE AND POSSESSION OF CERTAIN STATE VEHICLES--DISPOSITION OF REMAINDER.--The division shall retain title to and possession of one hundred of the state vehicles that are under its control on the effective date of this section. The state vehicles shall be kept, managed and

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1	maintained by the division in accordance with the provisions of							
2	Section 15-8-5 NMSA 1978. All remaining state vehicles shall be							
3	sold or the title and possession shall be transferred to the							
4	children, youth and families department, the human services							
5	department or the department of health."							
6	Section 7. REPEALSection 15-8-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws							
7	1994, Chapter 119, Section 2, as amended) is repealed.
