AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS TO PURCHASE, TRANSPORT, INSTALL OR EQUIP A COURT BUILDING FOR THE CANONCITO CHAPTER IN BERNALILLO COUNTY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--PURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED-- APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding three hundred thousand one hundred dollars (\$300,100) when the New Mexico office of Indian affairs certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the

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1 project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance  
2 and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable  
3 time. The state board of finance shall further take the  
4 appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue  
5 Code of 1986, as amended. The proceeds from the sale of the  
6 bonds are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian  
7 affairs for the purpose of purchasing, transporting, installing  
8 or equipping a court building for the Canoncito chapter located  
9 in Bernalillo county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance  
10 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the  
11 severance tax bonding fund. If the New Mexico office of Indian  
12 affairs has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds  
13 by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in  
14 this section shall be void.

15 Section 2. EMERGENCY. --It is necessary for the public  
16 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
