AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES: CLARIFYING THE PURPOSES FOR WHICH PROCEEDS FROM SEVERANCE TAX BOND APPROPRIATIONS TO THE NEW MEXICO OFFICE OF INDIAN AFFAIRS FOR VARIOUS HEADSTART PROGRAMS MAY BE EXPENDED; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--CLARIFYING PURPOSES--Section 1. APPROPRIATION. -- Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsections F through N of Section 16 of Chapter 148 of Laws 1994, the appropriations in those subsections from severance tax bond proceeds to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for various capital outlay purposes for each of the headstart programs in the communities of Coal Mine, Navajo, Rock Springs, Tsa-Ya-Toh, Crystal, Manuelito, Mexican Springs, Tohatchi and Twin Lakes located in McKinley and San Juan counties may be expended by

each community for any or all of the purposes stated in the subsection appropriating the proceeds to that community.

Section 2. EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
