15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 61-2-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1973,
17	Chapter 353, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"61-2-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Optometry Act:
19	A. "practice of optometry" means:
20	(1) the employment of any subjective or
21	objective means or methods, including the prescription or
22	administration of topical ocular pharmaceutical agents, for the
23	purpose of determining the visual defects or abnormal conditions
24	of the human eye and its adnexa; and
25	(2) the employing, adapting or prescribing of
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preventive or corrective measures by any means, including low 1 vision rehabilitation, orthoptics, vision therapy lenses, 2 prisms, contact or corneal lenses or other optical appliances; 3 refractive and therapeutic laser surgery procedures of the 4 anterior segment of the eye; and prescribing or administering 5 topical ocular pharmaceutical agents and oral pharmaceutical 6 agents as authorized in Section 61-2-10.2 NMSA 1978 for the 7 correction, relief or referral of visual defects or abnormal 8 conditions of the human eye and its adnexa. The "practice of 9 optometry" shall include the procedures and methods as taught by 10 an accredited school or college of optometry, if the optometrist 11 is qualified to do so by having passed the instruction and has 12 been credentialed to perform the procedure or method by the 13 board of optometric examiners, and shall not include the use of 14 incisional surgery [or injections in the treatment of eye 15 diseases; provided]. Persons who sell or dispense eyeglasses 16 upon prescription and who do not prescribe ophthalmic lenses for 17 the eyes shall not employ, adapt, dispense, modify, provide, 18 sell, give or fit contact or corneal lenses; and provided 19 further, the testing, design, dispensing and monitoring of a 20 contact lens fitting shall be performed at the optometrist's 21 place of practice; 22

B. "ophthalmic lens" means a lens that has a spherical, cylindrical or prismatic value and that is ground pursuant to a prescription and intended to be used as eyeglasses .114982.2

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or spectacles;

C. "contact or corneal lens" means any lens to be
worn on the anterior segment of the human eye, to be prescribed,
dispensed, adapted, employed, modified, provided, sold and
fitted by a licensed optometrist or physician;

D. "prescription" means a formula written for ophthalmic lenses, for a topical ocular pharmaceutical agent or for an oral pharmaceutical agent as authorized in Section 61-2-10.2 NMSA 1978 that comes under the provisions of the New Mexico Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act by a person duly licensed and containing the following essential elements:

(1) an order given individually for the person for whom prescribed, either directly from the prescriber to the pharmacist or indirectly by means of a written order signed by the prescriber, [and shall bear] that bears the name and address of the prescriber, his license classification, the name and address of the patient, the name and quantity of the drug prescribed, directions for use and the date of issue; or

(2) dioptric power of spheres, cylinders and prisms, axes of cylinders, position of prism base and, if so desired by the prescriber, light transmission properties and lens curve values;

(3) designation of pupillary distance; and

(4) name of patient, date of prescription,expiration date and the name and office location of prescriber;.114982.2

20	Section 2. Section 61-2-10.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995,				
21	Chapter 20, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:				
22	"61-2-10.2. DESIGNATION OF ORAL PHARMACEUTICAL AGENTS				
23	CERTIFICATION FOR USE OF CERTAIN AGENTS				
24	A. Subject to the provisions of the Optometry Act,				
25	optometrists qualified and certified by the board may				
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prescribe or administer the following classes of oral 1 pharmaceutical agents: 2 anti-infective medications, not (1) 3 including antifungals; 4 anti-glaucoma medications, not including (2) 5 osmotic medications: 6 (3) anti-allergy medications; 7 anti-inflammatory medications [not (4) 8 including oral corticosteroids and immunosuppression agents; 9 and 10 (5) analgesic medications, including 11 schedules III through V controlled substances, as provided in 12 the Controlled Substances Act. 13 The board shall issue certification for the use Β. 14 of oral pharmaceutical agents as set forth in Subsection A of 15 this section to optometrists currently licensed by the board 16 who are certified for the use of topical ocular pharmaceutical 17 To be certified, an optometrist shall submit to the agents. 18 board proof of having satisfactorily completed a course in 19 pharmacology as applied to optometry, with particular emphasis 20 on the administration of oral pharmaceutical agents, including 21 corticosteroids and immunosuppression agents for the purpose 22 of examination of the human eye, and analysis of ocular 23 functions and treatment of visual defects or abnormal 24 conditions of the human eye and its adnexa. The course shall 25 .114982.2

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constitute a minimum of twenty hours of instruction in
 clinical pharmacology, including systemic pharmacology as
 applied to optometry, and shall be taught by an accredited
 institution approved by the board.

5 C. As of July 1, 1996, all applicants for
6 licensure shall meet the requirements for certification in the
7 use of diagnostic, topical therapeutic and oral pharmaceutical
8 agents as set forth in the Optometry Act and shall
9 successfully complete the board's examination in diagnostic,
10 topical and oral pharmaceutical agents prior to licensure.

D. The certification authorized by this section shall be displayed in a conspicuous place in the optometrist's principal office or place of business."

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
