AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR THE RENOVATION OF THE BERNAL COMMUNITY CENTER IN SAN MIGUEL COUNTY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--PURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED-- APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding thirty-five thousand six hundred dollars (\$35,600) when the local government division of the department of finance and administration certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the

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1 board that the project has been developed sufficiently to  
2 justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to  
3 contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance  
4 shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply  
5 with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The  
6 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the  
7 local government division of the department of finance and  
8 administration for the purpose of purchasing equipment for,  
9 contracting for and constructing improvements to the Bernal  
10 community center located in San Miguel county. Any unexpended  
11 or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000  
12 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. If the local  
13 government division of the department of finance and  
14 administration has not certified the need for the issuance of  
15 the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization  
16 provided in this section shall be void.

17 Section 2. EMERGENCY. --It is necessary for the public  
18 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
