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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
16	"County Comprehensive Health Plan Act".
17	Section 2. PURPOSE OF ACTThe purpose of the County
18	Comprehensive Health Plan Act is to encourage the development of
19	countywide or multicounty comprehensive health plans to promote
20	better allocation of health care resources and better delivery
21	of health services to underserved populations.
22	Section 3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the County
23	Comprehensive Health Plan Act:
24	A. "board" means the board of county commissioners
25	of a county;
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1 B. "department" means the department of health; and "planning council" means the county comprehensive C. 2 health planning council. 3 PLANNING COUNCIL CREATED -- MEMBERSHIP. --Section 4. 4 The board may create a county comprehensive A. 5 health planning council and may appoint members for terms 6 designated by the board. The members of the planning council 7 shall be selected to represent a broad spectrum of interests 8 related to county health issues. 9 The planning council shall elect from its members **B**. 10 a chairman for a term designated by the board. The planning 11 council shall meet at the call of the chairman. 12 **C**. Planning council members shall not be paid, but 13 they may receive per diem and mileage expenses paid by the 14 county as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act. 15 COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH PLANS. --Section 5. 16 The board or its designee with the advice of the A. 17 planning council may prepare a county comprehensive health plan. 18 The plan shall have the approval of the planning council and the 19 board before it may be submitted by the board to the department 20 for approval. 21 Two or more boards may agree to establish a **B**. 22 multicounty comprehensive health plan. 23 C. Each county comprehensive health plan shall 24 include: 25 . 114280. 1

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1	(1) a county needs assessment that identifies
2	and quantifies:
3	(a) those populations whose health care
4	needs are not being met;
5	(b) the major factors that affect
6	accessibility to health services;
7	(c) the gaps in available health
8	services; and
9	(d) the extent to which county residents
10	use health services available in other counties;
11	(2) a county inventory that identifies existing
12	public and private providers, services and health plans,
13	medicaid and other governmental and charitable resources,
14	program duplications and the county's current monetary
15	contributions to health programs; and
16	(3) recommendations on how to improve and fund
17	health services in the county based on the county's needs
18	assessment and inventory of existing services and resources. In
19	its recommendations, the county shall include proposals to
20	eliminate duplication of services, improve access to health care
21	for underserved populations and initiate new services as needed.
22	The county shall also include conclusions about the need to rely
23	on services available in other counties and on the level of
24	charitable, federal, state and county funding and in-kind
25	contributions that are required to implement its plan fully.

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1	D. Development of the county comprehensive health
2	plan and recommendations may include consideration of:
3	(1) financing of care for persons not eligible
4	for medicaid;
5	(2) proposals to expand provider capacity;
6	(3) recruitment and retention of health
7	professi onal s;
8	(4) outreach and health education projects;
9	(5) projects that enhance use of preventive
10	care; and
11	(6) projects that coordinate local community
12	services, including those services provided by the public health
13	office in the county.
14	E. The county comprehensive health plan shall be
15	updated at the request of the board or the department if the
16	plan as implemented is not achieving the stated goals or if the
17	needs of the local population change.
18	Section 6. COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH PLAN FUNDS
19	A. The department may require a county to have a
20	department-approved comprehensive health plan as a condition of
21	the department contracting for health services in the county.
22	B. The department may require a county to contribute
23	funds or services to the development or implementation or both
24	of the county's comprehensive health plan as a condition of the
25	department contracting for health services to implement the
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Section 7. DEPARTMENT--POWERS AND DUTIES.--

A. The department shall review, evaluate and approve or reject a county comprehensive health plan, and the department may require that a county update its county comprehensive health plan.

B. The department is authorized to contract for
health services to implement county comprehensive health plans,
subject to the availability of appropriations for that purpose.

C. The department shall monitor and evaluate the contracts funded by the department and assess whether delivery of health services to previously underserved populations has increased.

D. The department shall provide technical assistance and training to assist each county as needed in developing its comprehensive health plan.

E. The department may gather information necessary to evaluate the effectiveness of services it contracts for through the provisions of the County Comprehensive Health Plan Act.

F. The department shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to carry out the purposes of the County Comprehensive Health Plan Act, including:

(1) the procedures and format for applying fordepartment approval of a county comprehensive health plan;

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1 (2)the format for county comprehensive health pl ans; 2 (3) the criteria to review. evaluate and 3 approve or reject a county comprehensive health plan; 4 the procedures and format for requesting (4) 5 6 that the department procure services under an approved county comprehensive health plan; 7 the formula used to determine a county's (5) 8 required contribution to implement its comprehensive health 9 pl an: 10 the procedure to determine a county's need (6) 11 for health services; 12 (7) the procedure to determine the distribution 13 of state funds appropriated to implement county comprehensive 14 health plans; 15 (8) the procedure for gathering and reporting 16 programmatic and financial information necessary to evaluate the 17 effectiveness of health services that the department contracts 18 for through the provisions of the County Comprehensive Health 19 Plan Act; and 20 (9) definitions that set an acceptable minimum 21 standard for the services provided. 22 Section 8. APPROPRIATION. -- One million dollars 23 (\$1,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the 24 department of health for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 for 25 . 114280. 1 - 6 -

	4	comprehensive health plans. Any unexpended or unencumbered
	5	balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to
