As used in this subsection, "convicted" means the defendant has been found guilty of a criminal charge by the magistrate or metropolitan judge, either after trial, a plea of guilty or a plea of nolo contendere. Magistrate judges, including metropolitan court judges, shall collect the following costs:

- C. Payments from the magistrate court mediation fund shall be made upon vouchers signed by the director of the administrative office of the courts upon warrants drawn by the secretary of finance and administration.
- D. Any balance remaining in the magistrate court mediation fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the state general fund.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 1997.
