RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF
SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS IN SANDOVAL COUNTY;
MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSAUTHORIZATIONS
APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS
A. The state board of finance may issue and sell
severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding
Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts
authorized for purposes specified in Sections 2 through 4 of
this act. The state board of finance shall schedule the
issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and
economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the
project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance

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and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated for the purposes specified in Sections 2 through 4 of this act.

B. The agencies named in Sections 2 through 4 of this act shall certify to the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this act.

C. If the specified agency has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.

D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Sections 2 through 4 of this act at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE AGENCY ON AGING--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state agency on aging that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the state agency on aging for the following purposes for projects located in Sandoval county:

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A. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) to complete an elderly daycare center at the pueblo of Cochiti;

twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to purchase a **B**. van for senior citizens at the pueblo of Cochiti; and

**C**. three hundred twenty-one thousand one hundred ten dollars (\$321,110) to expand the senior citizen center at the pueblo of San Felipe.

Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--OFFICE OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the office of cultural affairs that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) is appropriated to the office of cultural affairs for the purpose of equipping a newly constructed library at the pueblo of Cochiti located in Sandoval county.

Section 4. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--NEW MEXICO OFFICE OF INDIAN AFFAIRS -- PURPOSES. -- Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the New Mexico office of Indian affairs that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for the following purposes for projects located in Sandoval county:

thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$38,000) to A. purchase a bus for headstart and youth service activities at the pueblo of Cochiti; and

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1	B. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to plan
2	and design or install utility infrastructure in the Walatowa
3	educational heritage center at the pueblo of Jemez.
4	Section 5. EMERGENCYIt is necessary for the public
5	peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
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
