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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
18	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS
19	A. The state board of finance may issue and sell
20	severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding
21	Act in an amount not exceeding seven hundred ninety-nine
22	thousand seventy dollars (\$799,070) when the state department of
23	public education certifies the need for the issuance of the
24	bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance
25	and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical

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1	manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has
2	been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the
3	project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The
4	state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps
5	necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
6	amended. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
7	appropriated to the state department of public education in the
8	following amounts for the purpose of providing informational
9	technology systems in the following schools in Bernalillo
10	county:
11	(1) fifty thousand three hundred dollars
12	(\$50,300) for Valley high school;
13	(2) fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for
14	Garfield middle school;
15	(3) fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for Taft
16	middle school;
17	(4) fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for Taylor
18	middle school;
19	(5) sixty-five thousand dollars (\$65,000) for
20	Alameda elementary school;
21	(6) sixty-nine thousand eight hundred dollars
22	(\$69,800) for Alvarado elementary school;
23	(7) seventy-six thousand four hundred fifty-
24	five dollars (\$76,455) for Cochiti elementary school;
25	(8) seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) for
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1 Duranes elementary school; fifty-seven thousand seven hundred five 2 (9) dollars (\$57,705) for Griegos elementary school; 3 (10)seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) for La 4 Luz elementary school; 5 (11)seventy-four thousand nine hundred fifty 6 dollars (\$74,950) for Los Ranchos elementary school; 7 (12)fifty-two thousand seven hundred fifty 8 9 dollars (\$52,750) for MacArthur elementary school; and 10 sixty-two thousand one hundred ten dollars (13)11 (\$62,110) for Mission Avenue elementary school. 12 B. If the state department of public education has 13 not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end 14 of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this section 15 shall be void. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining 16 from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to 17 Subsection A of this section at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. 18 19 Section 2.
