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AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS IN CIBOLA COUNTY; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--AUTHORIZATIONS--APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in Sections 2 and 3 of this act. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the

project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated for the purposes specified in Sections 2 and 3 of this act.

- B. The agencies named in Sections 2 and 3 of this act shall certify to the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this act.
- C. If the specified agency has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.
- D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Sections 2 and 3 of this act at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF
ENVIRONMENT--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
of this act, upon certification by the department of environment
that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, three
hundred fifty-five thousand dollars (\$355,000) is appropriated
to the department of environment for the purpose of making
improvements to the Bibo community water system located in

Cibola county.

Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--NEW MEXICO OFFICE OF INDIAN AFFAIRS--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the New Mexico office of Indian affairs that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for the following purposes for projects in Cibola county;

- A. two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to improve or replace the domestic water system in the pueblo of Laguna;
- B. one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) to plan and design a juvenile and adult detention center in the pueblo of Laguna;
- C. two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to construct a records and archives facility in the pueblo of Acoma;
- D. one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) to construct, extend utilities to or prepare or complete the site development for a community recreational complex in the pueblo of Acoma;
- E. two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars(\$225,000) to continue renovation of the community center in the pueblo of Acoma;
- F. one million six hundred sixty-four thousand ninety-two dollars (\$1,664,092) to construct a community fire,

rescue and police complex in the pueblo of Acoma; and

one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) to construct or equip a community library in the pueblo of Acoma.

Section 4. EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
