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AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES: AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL PROJECTS IN COLFAX COUNTY; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SEVERANCE TAX BONDS -- AUTHORIZATIONS --Section 1. APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS. --

The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in Sections 2 through 6 of The state board of finance shall schedule the this act. issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance

and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated for expenditure in Colfax county for the purposes specified in Sections 2 through 6 of this act.

- B. The agencies named in Sections 2 through 6 of this act shall certify to the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this act.
- C. If the specified agency has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.
- D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Sections 2 through 6 of this act at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the local government division of the department of finance and administration that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the local government division of the

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department of finance and administration for the following purposes:

- A. two hundred sixty-eight thousand dollars (\$268,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping an addition, including a kitchen, to the daycare facility at the Colfax county workshop for the developmentally disabled;
- B. ninety-eight thousand six hundred forty dollars (\$98,640) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping a daycare addition, including paving the parking area, to the community multipurpose service center near Raton high school;
- C. one hundred one thousand seven hundred twenty dollars (\$101,720) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping a wellness center addition to the community multipurpose center near Raton high school;
- D. sixty-five thousand dollars (\$65,000) for various renovations and remodeling of the county courthouse in Raton, including drainage and landscaping work and improvements necessary for compliance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990;
- E. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for various repairs and renovations of the county state agency building in Raton;
- F. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for remodeling the sheriff's office in Raton for compliance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990;

- H. three hundred fifteen thousand dollars (\$315,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping a community and senior citizen center in the village of Cimarron.
- Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF

 ENVIRONMENT--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1

 of this act, upon certification by the department of environment that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the department of environment for the following purposes:
- A. one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping a water and wastewater system in the town of Springer;
- B. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for improvements to the water and wastewater distribution lines in the village of Cimarron;
- C. thirty thousand eight hundred dollars (\$30,800) for improvements to the water and wastewater system, including a water filtration system, for the community of Miami; and
- D. six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping improvements to the water and wastewater system in the village of Eagle Nest.
 - Section 4. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE HIGHWAY AND

TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state highway and transportation department that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, three hundred eighty-six thousand seven hundred dollars (\$386,700) is appropriated to the state highway and transportation department for the purpose of planning, designing, constructing and repairing various streets and roads in the village of Maxwell.

Section 5. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EDUCATION--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state department of public education that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the state department of public education for the following purposes:

- A. one hundred forty-five thousand dollars (\$145,000) for the purchase and installation of educational technology in various Cimarron municipal schools;
- B. one hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$180,000) for various improvements to the vocational education laboratories at Cimarron high school and Eagle Nest and Cimarron middle schools:
- C. two hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$270,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping restrooms in the new student commons at Cimarron high school; and
 - D. sixty-two thousand dollars (\$62,000) for purchase

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and installation of equipment, landscaping and other necessary improvements to playgrounds at Eagle Nest and Cimarron elementary schools.

Section 6. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--OFFICE OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS--PURPOSE. -- Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the office of cultural affairs that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated to the office of cultural affairs for purchasing and equipping a rural library services bookmobile, based in Cimarron, to serve north central and northeast New Mexico.

EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public Section 7. peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
