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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 60-7B-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
17	Chapter 68, Section 22) is amended to read:
18	"60-7B-1. SELLING OR GIVING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO
19	MI NORS POSSESSI ON
20	A. It is a violation of the Liquor Control Act for
21	any person, <u>including a person</u> licensed pursuant to the
22	provisions of the Liquor Control Act, or any employee, agent or
23	lessee of that person, if he knows or has reason to know that he
24	is violating the provisions of this section, to:
	(1) sell, serve or give any alcoholic beverages
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to a minor or permit a minor to consume alcoholic beverages on the licensed premises;

- (2) buy alcoholic beverages for or procure the sale or service of alcoholic beverages to a minor;
  - (3) deliver alcoholic beverages to a minor; or
- (4) aid or assist a minor to buy, procure or be served with alcoholic beverages.
- B. It is a violation of the Liquor Control Act for any minor to buy, attempt to buy, receive, possess or permit himself to be served with any alcoholic beverages.
- C. In the event any person except a minor procures any other person to sell, serve or deliver any alcoholic beverages to a minor by actual or constructive misrepresentation of any facts calculated to cause, or by a concealment of any facts the concealment of which is calculated to cause, the person selling, serving or delivering the alcoholic beverages to the minor to believe that such minor is legally entitled to be sold, served or delivered alcoholic beverages and actually deceiving him by such misrepresentation or concealment, then that person and not the person so deceived by such misrepresentation or concealment shall have violated the Liquor Control Act.
- D. As used in the Liquor Control Act, "minor" means any person under twenty-one years of age.
  - [E. Violation of this section by a minor with

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respect to possession is a petty misdemeanor. Upon conviction, the offender may be sentenced in accordance with Section 31-19-1 NMSA 1978. Any sentence imposed pursuant to this subsection may be suspended in the discretion of the court upon the condition that:

(1) the minor accepts the suspension of his driver's license for a period not to exceed three months, whereupon the trial court may dismiss the possession of alcoholic beverage charge and it shall not be considered a conviction. In the event the minor's driver's license is to be suspended, the trial court shall inform the motor vehicle division of the taxation and revenue department of the action; provided, however, if the minor drives during the period of suspension, then the court may impose a fine, jail sentence or both, such fine and sentence not to exceed the maximums imposed for petty misdemeanors or may impose punishment pursuant to Paragraph (2) of this subsection; and

(2) the minor assist in a community project designated by the court, up to fifty hours, whereupon the trial court may dismiss the possession of alcoholic beverage charge and it shall not be considered a conviction.

E. A violation of Subsection A of this section is a misdemeanor, and shall, in addition to the penalties available under Section 60-6C-1 NMSA 1978, be punishable as follows:

(1) for the first violation, by a fine of not

1	less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) and not more than
2	seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) and by thirty hours of
3	community service, designated by the court, related to reducing
4	the incidence of driving under the influence of intoxicating
5	<u>liquor;</u>
6	(2) for the second violation, by a fine of not
7	less than five hundred dollars (\$500) and not more than one
8	thousand dollars (\$1,000) and by forty hours of community
9	service, designated by the court, related to reducing the
10	incidence of driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor;
11	<u>and</u>
12	(3) for each subsequent violation, by a fine of
13	not less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and not more than
14	two thousand dollars (\$2,000) and by sixty hours of community
15	service, designated by the court, related to reducing the
16	incidence of driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor.
17	F. A violation of Subsection B of this section is a
18	misdemeanor and shall be punishable as follows:
19	(1) for the first violation, by a fine of not
20	less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) and not more than
21	seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) and by thirty hours of
22	community service, designated by the court, related to reducing
23	the incidence of driving under the influence of intoxicating
24	<u>liquor;</u>
25	(2) for the second violation, by a fine of not

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less than five hundred dollars (\$500) and not more than one
thousand dollars (\$1,000), by forty hours of community service
designated by the court, related to reducing the incidence of
driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor and by:

(a) suspension of the minor's driver's license for a period of ninety days; or

(b) if the minor is too young to possess a driver's license, by adding ninety days to the date on which the minor becomes eligible to obtain a driver's license; and

(3) for each subsequent offense, by a fine of not less than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) and not more than one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500), by fifty hours of community service, designated by the court, related to reducing the incidence of driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor and by suspension of the minor's driver's license for a period of two years or until the minor reaches the age of twenty-one, whichever is greater.

G. A violation of Subsection C of this section is a misdemeanor and shall be punishable as follows:

(1) for the first violation, by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) and not more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) and by thirty hours of community service, designated by the court, related to reducing the incidence of driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor;

(2) for the second violation, by a fine of not
less than five hundred dollars (\$500) and not more than one
thousand dollars (\$1,000) and by sixty hours of community
service, designated by the court, related to reducing the
incidence of driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor;
and

(3) for each subsequent offense, by a fine of not less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and not more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000), by one hundred hours of community service, designated by the court, related to reducing the incidence of driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor and by imprisonment in the county jail for a definite period of not less than two and not more than five days."
