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AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES: AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL PROJECTS IN MORA COUNTY; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SEVERANCE TAX BONDS -- AUTHORIZATIONS --Section 1. APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS. --

The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in Sections 2 through 5 of The state board of finance shall schedule the this act. issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance

and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated for expenditure in Mora county for the purposes specified in Sections 2 through 5 of this act.

- B. The agencies named in Sections 2 through 5 of this act shall certify to the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this act.
- C. If the specified agency has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.
- D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Sections 2 through 5 of this act at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the local government division of the department of finance and administration that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the local government division of the

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department of finance and administration for the following purposes in Mora county:

- six hundred five thousand dollars (\$605,000) for the Mora county courthouse for various electrical and mechanical renovations and remodeling necessary for compliance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990;
- B. one million five hundred forty thousand dollars (\$1,540,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping a county community and office center;
- nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping an addition to the Mora county courthouse and remodeling parts of the existing courthouse:
- twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for D. planning, designing, constructing and equipping a road department shop at the old county landfill;
- three hundred twenty-five thousand dollars Ε. (\$325,000) for planning, designing, remodeling and equipping the old county jail to accommodate juvenile prisoners, and for purchasing and installing law enforcement equipment;
- two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for F. purchasing and equipping a D-6-H bulldozer and two dump trucks for county maintenance and road work;
- two hundred seventy thousand dollars (\$270,000) G. for planning, designing, constructing, equipping and purchasing

land for a county fairgrounds;

- H. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars(\$125,000) for planning, designing, constructing, landscapingand equipping a community park in the town of Mora;
- $I. \quad \text{one hundred thousand dollars ($100,000) for} \\ \text{purchasing and equipping an ambulance for the community of Wagon} \\ \text{Mound;} \\$
- J. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for planning, designing, constructing, remodeling and equipping the municipal building in the community of Wagon Mound; and
- K. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping a municipal building to house emergency equipment in the community of Wagon Mound.
- Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF

 ENVIRONMENT--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1

 of this act, upon certification by the department of environment that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the department of environment for the following purposes in Mora county:
- A. one million four hundred fifty-five thousand dollars (\$1,455,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping a new domestic and wastewater system for the unincorporated community of Mora, including line replacement, installation of a seventy-five thousand gallon tank and improvement of the settlement lagoons;

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- B. thirty-one thousand five hundred dollars (\$31,500) for improvements to and extension of the sanitary sewer lines, including meter installations, in the community of El Alto:
- C. one million twenty-five thousand dollars (\$1,025,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping improvements to various community domestic water and wastewater systems throughout the county; and
- D. one million six hundred forty-seven thousand dollars (\$1,647,000) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping a new wastewater system, including new wastewater lines, in the community of Watrous.

Section 4. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EDUCATION--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state department of public education that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the state department of public education for the following purposes in Mora county:

- A. two hundred twenty-three thousand nine hundred ten dollars (\$223,910) for improvements to the water system at Mora high school, including upgrading the pressurized water line system;
- B. one hundred twenty thousand eight hundred fifty dollars (\$120,850) for planning, designing, constructing and equipping the swimming pool at Mora high school; and

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C. ninety thousand four hundred fifty dollars (\$90,450) for improvements to various schools in the Wagon Mound public school district, including completely re-roofing the high school building and plastering the gym building.

SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE HIGHWAY AND Section 5. TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT -- PURPOSES. -- Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state highway and transportation department that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the state highway and transportation department for the following purposes in Mora county:

- one hundred forty thousand dollars (\$140,000) for improvements to Tramperos road, designated county road B-015;
- В. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for improvements to Watrous road, designated C-022;
- C. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for improvements to one and nine-tenths miles of county road A-002 west of the junction with state road 94; and
- three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) for improvements to El Alto road, designated A-030.
- EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public Section 6. peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
