MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR VARIOUS SENIOR CITIZEN PROGRAMS THROUGHOUT NEW MEXICO.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

## Section 1. APPROPRIATION. --

A. Five million one hundred thirteen thousand seven hundred thirty-six dollars (\$5,113,736) is appropriated from the general fund to the state agency on aging for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 for the following purposes and in the following amounts:

(1) three million eight hundred seventeen thousand nine hundred fifty-six dollars (\$3,817,956) to the six area agencies on aging for senior services, including case management, respite care, including Alzheimer's respite care, adult daycare, congregate meals, transportation and in-home

services;

- (2) seven hundred twenty-three thousand one hundred eighty dollars (\$723, 180) to provide increased volunteer positions for the foster grandparent, senior companion and retired senior volunteer programs;
- (3) one hundred forty-four thousand five hundred dollars (\$144,500) for increased information and assistance and consultation and education services for individuals with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders and their families or caregivers;
- (4) twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for statewide senior citizen olympics activities;
- (5) two hundred seventy-eight thousand two hundred dollars (\$278, 200) for statewide long-term care ombudsman services; and
- (6) one hundred twenty-nine thousand nine hundred dollars (\$129,900) for an elder rights initiative assisting older individuals to access the medicaid managed care system.
- B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.
