All employees covered by Subsection A of this 2 **B**. section who customarily and regularly receive more than thirty 3 dollars (\$30.00) a month in tips shall be paid a minimum hourly 4 5 wage of [two dollars twelve and one-half cents (\$2.125)] fifty 6 percent of the minimum wage as provided in Subsection A of this The employer may consider tips as part of wages, but 7 section. such a wage credit shall not exceed fifty percent of the minimum 8 9 wage. All tips received by such employees shall be retained by 10 the employee, except that nothing [herein] in this section shall 11 prohibit the pooling of tips among employees.

C. No employee covered by the provisions of Subsection A of this section shall be required to work more than forty hours in any week of seven days, unless he is paid one and one-half times his regular hourly rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours."

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
