AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCE; AMENDING SECTION 22-8-24 NMSA 1978 (BEING LAWS 1974, CHAPTER 8, SECTION 15, AS AMENDED BY LAWS 1993, CHAPTER 91, SECTION 1 AND ALSO BY LAWS 1993, CHAPTER 237, SECTION 3).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 22-8-24 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1974, Chapter 8, Section 15, as amended by Laws 1993, Chapter 91, Section 1 and also by Laws 1993, Chapter 237, Section 3) is amended to read:

"22-8-24. INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE INDEX-- DEFINITIONS-- FACTORS-- CALCULATIONS. --

A. For the purpose of calculating the instructional staff training and experience index, the following definitions and limitations shall apply:

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1 (1) "instructional staff" means the personnel
2 assigned to the instructional program of the school district,
3 excluding principals, substitute teachers, instructional aides,
4 secretaries and clerks;

5 (2) the number of instructional staff to be
6 counted in calculating the instructional staff training and
7 experience index is the actual number of full-time equivalent
8 instructional staff on the October payroll;

9 (3) the number of years of experience to be
10 used in calculating the instructional staff training and
11 experience index is that number of years of experience allowed
12 for salary increment purposes on the salary schedule of the
13 school district; and

14 (4) the academic degree and additional credit
15 hours to be used in calculating the instructional staff training
16 and experience index is the degree and additional [~~semester~~]
17 credit hours allowed for salary increment purposes on the salary
18 schedule of the school district.

19 B. In determining the academic classification for
20 instructional staff, additional credit hours earned after
21 completion of a baccalaureate degree shall be counted regardless
22 of whether the hours are earned prior to or after the completion
23 of a subsequent degree.

24 [~~B.-~~] C. The factors for each classification of
25 academic training by years of experience are provided in the

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1 following table:

19 [~~C.~~] D. The instructional staff training and
20 experience index for each school district shall be calculated
21 in accordance with instructions issued by the state
22 superintendent. The following calculations shall be computed:

23 (1) multiply the number of full-time
24 equivalent instructional staff in each academic classification
25 by the numerical factor in the appropriate "years of

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1 experience" column provided in the table in Subsection ~~[B]~~ C
2 of this section;

3 (2) add the products calculated in Paragraph
4 (1) of this subsection; and

5 (3) divide the total obtained in Paragraph
6 (2) of this subsection by the total number of full-time
7 equivalent instructional staff.

8 ~~[D.]~~ E. In the event that the result of the
9 calculation of the training and experience index is 1.0 or
10 less, the district's factor shall be no less than 1.0.

11 ~~[E.]~~ F. In the event that a new school district is
12 created, the training and experience index for that district is
13 1.12. "

14 Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. --The effective date of the
15 provisions of this act is July 1, 1997.
