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AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES; ENACTING A NEW SECTION OF THE NMSA 1978 TO AUTHORIZE THE NEW MEXICO PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION TO PERMIT RETAIL WHEELING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

A new section of Chapter 62, Article 6 NMSA Section 1. 1978 is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] RETAIL WHEELING PERMITTED--AUTHORITY OF COMMISSION. --

A. The intent and purpose of this section is to permit and encourage retail wheeling in the electric utility industry without impairing the provision of electric service to the state's residents. The commission may, by rule or order, authorize the nondiscriminatory and nonpreferential retail wheeling of electricity by any person subject to its

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- The commission may, in its discretion, impose В. such terms and conditions on permitted retail wheeling as may be necessary to safeguard the adequacy, reliability and efficiency of electric service and to prevent undue hardship to or anticompetitive conduct by or on persons subject to its j uri sdi cti on.
- C. The rates and charges for the permitted retail wheeling of electricity shall be just, reasonable, nondiscriminatory and subject to the approval of the commission.
- The commission shall by rule or order adopt D. directives, standards, forms and reporting requirements to effectuate this section.
- The commission shall ensure that benefits available from retail wheeling accrue to electricity consumers as may be reasonably and equitably practical.
- F. The commission shall conduct public hearings on any order or rule implementing retail wheeling in the electric utility industry to determine all legitimate and verifiable transition costs. The commission shall identify the transition costs of each person subject to its jurisdiction and shall report to the legislature before December 15, 1997 its findings and recommendations, by person, relating to the amount and recovery of transition costs.
 - Nothing in this section shall alter or modify the

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authority of the commission to regulate the rates and services of a person otherwise subject to its jurisdiction."

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
