15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
17	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
18	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
19	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding three hundred eight
20	thousand six hundred seventeen dollars (\$308,617) when the New
21	Mexico office of Indian affairs certifies the need for the
22	issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall
23	schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most
24	expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the
25	board that the project has been developed sufficiently to

1 justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance 2 shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply 3 with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The 4 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New 5 6 Mexico office of Indian affairs for the purpose of designing, constructing or equipping athletic fields and facilities and 7 designing and constructing a storage facility for the Laguna 8 9 middle school located in Cibola county. Any unexpended or 10 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 11 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. If the New 12 Mexico office of Indian affairs has not certified the need for 13 the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the 14 authorization provided in this section shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
