### AN ACT

RELATING TO COURTS; INCREASING CERTAIN COURT FEES; CREATING A FUND; DEDICATING PROCEEDS IN THE FUND FOR THE PROVISION OF CIVIL LEGAL SERVICES TO INDIGENT PERSONS; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 34-6-40 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1968, Chapter 69, Section 42, as amended) is amended to read:

"34-6-40. FI NANCE--FEES. --

A. District court clerks shall collect in civil matters docketing any cause, whether original or reopened or by appeal or transfer from any inferior court, a fee of [eighty-two dollars (\$82.00)] one hundred seven dollars (\$107), ten dollars (\$10.00) of which shall be deposited in the court automation fund and twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) of which shall be deposited in the civil legal services fund.

1	B. No fees or costs shall be taxed against the
2	state, its political subdivisions or the nonprofit corporations
3	authorized to be formed under the Educational Assistance Act.
4	C. Except as otherwise specifically provided by law,
5	docket fees shall be paid into the general fund."

Copying fee, for making and certifying copies of any
records in the court, for each page copied by
photographic process
Copying fee, for computer-generated or electronically
transferred copies, per page 1.00
Proceeds from this copying fee shall be transferred
to the administrative office of the courts for
deposit in the court automation fund. Except as
otherwise specifically provided by law, docket fees
shall be paid into the general fund.

- B. Except as otherwise provided by law, no other costs or fees shall be charged or collected in the magistrate or metropolitan court.
- C. The magistrate or metropolitan court may grant free process to any party in any civil proceeding or special statutory proceeding upon a proper showing of indigency. The magistrate or metropolitan court may deny free process if it finds that the complaint on its face does not state a cause of action.
- D. As used in this subsection, "convicted" means the defendant has been found guilty of a criminal charge by the magistrate or metropolitan judge, either after trial, a plea of guilty or a plea of nolo contendere. Magistrate judges, including metropolitan court judges, shall collect the following costs:

E. Metropolitan court judges shall collect as costs
a mediation fee not to exceed five dollars (\$5.00) for the
docketing of small claims and criminal actions specified by
metropolitan court rule. Proceeds of the mediation fee shall be
denosited into the metropolitan court mediation fund "

## Section 3. [NEW MATERIAL] CIVIL LEGAL SERVICES FUND CREATED--ADMINISTRATION--DISTRIBUTION.--

- A. There is created in the state treasury the "civil legal services fund" to be administered by the administrative office of the courts.
- B. Balances in the civil legal services fund may be expended by the administrative office of the courts for the purpose of entering into contracts with nonprofit organizations that:
- (1) offer a range of free or reduced-fee civil legal services to indigent persons in New Mexico; and
- (2) demonstrate the capacity to cooperate with state and local bar associations, pro bono programs and private attorneys to increase the availability of free or reduced-fee civil legal services to indigent persons.
- C. A contract entered into for the purpose of providing civil legal services to indigent persons shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Procurement Code.
- D. Balances in the civil legal services fund shall not revert to the general fund at the end of any fiscal year.

E. Payments from the civil legal services fund shall be made upon vouchers issued and signed by the director of the administrative office of the courts upon warrants drawn by the secretary of finance and administration.

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 1997.
