15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSAUTHORIZATIONS
17	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS
18	A. The state board of finance may issue and sell
19	severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding
20	Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts
21	authorized for purposes specified in Sections 2 and 3 of this
22	act. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and
23	sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner
24	possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been
25	developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the

project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated for the purposes specified in Sections 2 and 3 of this act.

B. The agencies named in Sections 2 and 3 of this act shall certify to the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this act.

C. If the specified agency has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.

D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Sections 2 and 3 of this act at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--NEW MEXICO OFFICE OF INDIAN AFFAIRS--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the New Mexico office of Indian affairs that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for the following purposes:
