AN ACT

RELATING TO WELFARE REFORM; PROVIDING THAT LEGAL IMMIGRANTS AND UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS RECEIVE CERTAIN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SOCIAL AND EDUCATION SERVICES--PROVIDED TO LEGAL AND UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS.--

- A. Legal immigrants shall be eligible to receive the following services and programs from the state:
 - (1) emergency medical and health services;
 - (2) Title 20 social services;
 - (3) state child care assistance:
- (4) women, infants and children nutrition programs and other commodity benefits; and
 - (5) child and adult care food programs.
- B. Undocumented immigrants shall be eligible to receive health services from the state.
