17	Section 1. Section 30-16-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963,
18	Chapter 303, Section 16-3, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"30-16-3. BURGLARYBurglary consists of the unauthorized
20	entry of any vehicle, watercraft, aircraft, dwelling <u>house,</u>
21	residential dwelling or other structure, movable or immovable,
22	with the intent to commit any felony or theft therein.
23	A. Any person who, without authorization, enters a
24	dwelling house or residential dwelling with intent to commit any
25	felony or theft therein is guilty of a third degree felony.

1	B. Any person who commits burglary of a dwelling
2	house or residential dwelling, as provided in Subsection A of
3	this section, who has a prior conviction for burglary of a
4	<u>dwelling house or residential dwelling, shall have his basic</u>
5	sentence increased by three years for each prior conviction for
6	<u>burglary of a dwelling house or residential dwelling.</u>
7	<u>C. For the purposes of this section, "prior</u>
8	conviction for burglary of a dwelling house or residential
9	<u>dwelling" means:</u>
10	(1) a prior conviction under Subsection A of
11	<u>this section; or</u>
12	(2) a prior conviction in any other
13	jurisdiction, territory or possession of the United States when
14	the criminal act is burglarizing a dwelling house or residential
15	<u>dwelling.</u>
16	[B.] <u>D.</u> Any person who, without authorization,
17	enters any vehicle, watercraft, aircraft or other structure,
18	movable or immovable, with intent to commit any felony or theft
19	therein is guilty of a fourth degree felony."
