15	Section 1. Section 7-38-25 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1973,
16	Chapter 258, Section 65, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"7-38-25. COUNTY VALUATION PROTESTS BOARDSCREATION
18	DUTI ES FUNDI NG
19	A. There is created in each county a "county
20	valuation protests board". Each board shall consist of three
21	voting members. <u>Three alternates shall also be appointed to</u>
22	serve as voting members in the absence of a voting member.
23	<u>Voting members and alternates shall be</u> appointed as follows:
24	(1) one member <u>and one alternate</u> shall be a
25	qualified elector of the county and shall be appointed by the
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board of county commissioners for a term of two years;

- (2) one member <u>and one alternate</u> shall be a qualified elector of the county, shall have demonstrated experience in the field of valuation of property and shall be appointed by the board of county commissioners for a term of two years; and
- (3) one member <u>and one alternate</u> shall be a property appraisal officer employed by the department, assigned by the director and shall be the chairman of the board.
- B. [No member] Members of the board and alternates appointed under Paragraph (1) or (2) of Subsection A of this section shall not hold any elective public office during the term of [his] their appointment nor shall any such member or alternate be employed by the state, a political subdivision or a school district during the term of his appointment.
- C. Vacancies occurring on the board shall be filled by the authority making the original appointment and shall be for the unexpired term of the vacated membership.
- D. The county valuation protests board shall hear and decide protests of determinations made by county assessors and protested under Section 7-38-24 NMSA 1978.
- E. Members of the board <u>and alternates when serving</u> <u>as voting members</u> appointed under Paragraphs (1) and (2) of Subsection A of this section shall be paid as independent contractors at the rate of eighty dollars (\$80.00) a day for each

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day of actual service. The payment of board members <u>and</u>
<u>alternates</u> and all other actual and direct expenses incurred in
connection with protest hearings shall be paid by the [division]
department. "
