17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
19	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
20	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
21	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding three hundred eighty
22	thousand dollars (\$380,000) when the New Mexico office of Indian
23	affairs certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The
24	state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of
25	the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible

1 upon a finding by the board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can 2 proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board 3 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to 4 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. 5 The 6 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the New Mexico office of Indian affairs for the purpose of completing 7 the construction of, furnishing and equipping a multipurpose 8 9 building for senior citizens and head start students in Red 10 Valley located in San Juan county. Any unexpended or 11 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 12 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. If the New 13 Mexico office of Indian affairs has not certified the need for 14 the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the 15 authorization provided in this section shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
