The state board 2 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to 3 comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The 4 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the 5 6 office of cultural affairs for the purpose of building permanent exhibitions at the farm and ranch heritage museum located in 7 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance 8 Dona Ana county. 9 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the 10 severance tax bonding fund. If the office of cultural affairs 11 has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the 12 end of fiscal year 1999, the authorization provided in this 13 section shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
